# **Guarding Against Gossip**

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## I. <u>Introduction</u>

A. Definition: "Speaking about someone in a way that defames, dishonors, or otherwise hurts character."

Criteria: The listener does not need to know. It doesn't require action.

- B. This is a serious problem.
  - 1. In interpersonal relationships: family, friends. Luke 12:51-53
  - 2. In the church.
  - 3. In the counseling office.
  - 4. Social media quickly spreads gossip.
- C. We are all capable of gossip.
- D. Don't ignore it or hope it doesn't do too much damage.

#### II. <u>The Bible addresses this issue.</u>

- A. In the Old Testament.
  - 1. Gossip hurts. Proverbs 12:18
  - 2. Noah's shame. Genesis 9:20-27
  - 3. Job's friends.
  - 4. David and Ziba. II Sam. 16:1-4/II Sam. 19:24-30
- B. In the New Testament.
  - 1. The tongue is hard to tame. James 3:1-8
  - 2. It is in a list of serious sins. Romans 1:29

#### III. <u>The damage this sin can cause.</u>

- A. Since this is a sin, we need to put it to death. Romans 8:13 Col. 3:5 Heb. 12:1-2
- B. Gossips hurt themselves. Prov. 19:5
- C. Gossips hurt their hearers. Proverbs 17:4 Prov. 6:16-19
  - 1. We can be tempted to lead someone to gossip.
  - 2. We can be tempted to think badly about others based on what someone has told us, without proof.
- D. Gossips hurt the one being gossiped about.
- IV. <u>The difficulty in confronting this sin.</u>
  - A. We may find it hard to determine if a story is gossipy.
  - B. This sin is appealing to us. Prov. 18:8 Prov. 26:22
  - C. We talk too much and gossip spills out. Prov. 10:19 Prov. 20:19
  - D. We may become the next subject for the gossip!
- V. <u>The blessings of avoiding this sin.</u>
  - A. God calls us to be trustworthy. Prov. 14:15
  - B. God promises that when we stay away from a gossip, we will be blessed. Proverb 20:19
    Proverbs 17:4

- VI. <u>What should we do when we hear gossip?</u>
  - A. Refuse to listen.
  - B. Rebuke the sin.
    - 1. Interrupt.
    - 2. Call it a sin.
  - C. Redirect it.
    - 1. Jesus died for this sin.
    - 2. Send the person back to the one who offended them.
    - 3. If the gossip was a lie, confess and ask forgiveness.
      - a. Forgiveness from God.
      - b. Forgiveness from the person who was told.
      - c. Forgiveness from the person who was the target of the gossip.
    - 4. Suggest following up later.
- VII. <u>How should our speech be governed?</u>
  - T Is it true? H – Is it honest?
  - I Is it inspiring?
  - N-Is it necessary?
  - K Is it kind?
